ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP:

ARTICLE IV DUES:

Members shall be notified by the Treasurer. If dues are not paid by the April meeting, any such member shall be dropped from the rolls. Re-instatement may be made upon a \$5.00 late fee and payment of dues.

ORGANIZED: Women's Improvement Club of Roseville, WICR, was chartered in October 1910. WICR is a non-profit, civic improvement and service club. The club is non-partisan, non-denominational and is affiliated with the General Federation of Women's Clubs, International, the oldest Women's Club in the nation, since 1911. Donations are tax-exempt.

OBJECTIVE: The objective of the club is to develop fellowship among its members, to encourage civic responsibilities, and to further its members to seek, through learning, a richer life for themselves and their families.

CURRENT PROJECTS: Members are making comfort pillows for cancer patients and hospital gowns and smile bags for Operation Smile. We collect books for the Roseville libraries and pull-tabs for Ronald McDonald House. For the Giving Tree at Woodbridge Elementary School members bring in toys, school supplies, and books for children. Personal care items are donated to Stand Up Placer for domestic violence victims and to The Gathering Inn for the homeless. Coupons are cut for military families overseas to use in the commissary and used postage stamps for projects for our wounded veterans in veteran facilities who got there providing for our freedom.

REGULAR MEETINGS: Lunch meetings are held at Denny's Restaurant, 122 Sunrise in Roseville on the 4th Wednesday, September through May.

SOME ACCOMPLISHMENT AND ACTIVITIES

Developed the city's first park, Woodbridge Park, successfully petitioned for the City's first tennis courts in Royer Park, planted flowers and trees at city parks and schools. Raised public awareness to the need of a solid waste disposal system, organized and staffed cleanup crews prior to the city's own program. The club is responsible for establishing the city's first library, the Carnegie. Brought the first musical programs and flower shows to the area and continue to support the cultural arts. The club's major fundraiser is to provide college scholarships to aged-out foster youth and to support our military veterans.
